Hilda's Corner-Taking Care of Tax Business

It's January, many of us are getting ready to do taxes. As we age, it's not as clear if we have to prepare a tax return. Because each of you are different, it is helpful if you can get assistance without breaking your bank.

Fortunately, there are two great programs that can assist you at no cost. The Volunteer Income Tax Assistance Program (VITA) and AARP's Tax-Aide. Both offer free services if you do not already have a tax professional. VITA is offered at Hancock College (Saturday 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. February 10th-April 13th), Cal Poly (Saturday 9:30 a.m. to 2 p.m. February 3rd-March 16th) and at the United Way office in Santa Maria (1660 N. Broadway) Monday through Friday from 10 to 1 p.m. (February 10th to April 13th). You can visit www.myfreetaxes.org to schedule an appointment or call the local United Way office at 805.922.0329 extension 4. For AARP, services are offered in Solvang Monday and Friday afternoons (call 805.688.3793 to schedule appointment) and Lompoc (Dick Dewees Community Center in Lompoc Monday and Friday 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. drop-in from February 2nd to April 12th). For South County you can contact the Santa Barbara County United Way office at www.unitedwaysb.org\VITA or call at 805-965-8591. If you have a complicated tax situation, you may not qualify for these free services. We are lucky to have these volunteers to help us understand what we need to do! Finally, spring is coming, remember to enjoy the sunshine!
